AGES 12 AND UP (JR. ZOOKEEPERS) 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. Jr. Zookeepers

Have you ever wondered what it's like to be a zookeeper? Campers will spend their week in the contact barn getting their hands dirty through general animal husbandry, trying out their training and enrichment skills, and interacting with the public, just like keepers do! This camp involves work experience, and campers should expect to get dirty, hot, sweaty, and smelly as they face the challenges of being a zookeeper. Campers must have a negative TB test within one year of the start of the session.

This camp is offered the following weeks:

Jr. Zookeepers 2.0 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Campers will expand on their skills gained in Junior Zookeeper and have the opportunity to explore different elements of the zoo. We will be deep diving into incredible animal and environmental concepts, STEAM projects, and experiences with our most beloved animals. By the end of the week, campers will give a "keeper chat" on an animal of their choosing. Campers must have a negative TB test within one year of the start of the session.

*This program is by application or invitation only. Invitations are only extended to participants in prior Jr. Zookeeper programming at the Rosamond Gifford Zoo. Applications are open to individuals with, but not limited to, prior internship, shadowing, or animal handling experience at another zoo, aquarium, and/or farm (or participation in other programs, such as the 4H Club). High school students with relative interest and no prior experience will also be considered. Invitations and applications are subject to review and approval by the camp director.

What can I expect with the camp management system?

The Rosamond Gifford Zoo utilizes a camp software system that streamlines and improves the registration process, record keeping, attendance and safety and wellness of your child(ren). All personal, emergency, and medical information entered is kept securely and immediately accessible to camp staff, increasing our ability to perform to the highest quality. You can even sign up for a payment plan with a qualifying deposit at no extra cost! Parents will be able to purchase items such as additional shirts, hats, and water bottles as well as purchase meal plans! Education staff will be available to assist with learning and manipulating the system.

Members: Please make sure your membership

is up to date prior to March 5. A membership discount code will be provided to members prior to the registration date. You will need your membership number for verification prior to registration to receive the discount. Please note that the participant must be covered under the membership account number to receive the discount. If non-members utilize the membership discount and membership registration period, you will be refunded and placed on the waitlist to be contacted when non-member registration begins. Call membership at (315) 435-8511 x8537 for any questions or concerns related to your membership account or to sign up for a membership.

What if I want to mail in my registration?

Mail-in registrations will no longer be accepted or processed. Please contact the Education department at (315) 435-8511 x8506 for assistance with registering online for the best possible service and experience.

Can I register more than one child?

Yes! Registering multiple children for sessions is easy in our online system!

Can I register my child for an 'older' or 'younger' class?

As educators, we feel that campers maximize their Zoo Camp experience by interacting with peers of their own age level. All sessions are designed to offer handson learning that is age appropriate. The registration system will only show you the age-appropriate options available for your child. If there is no availability for your child for sessions in their age group, you can be placed

on a waitlist through the registration system. Admission is on a first-come, first-served basis as space becomes available. Exemptions to the age requirement can be made only if space becomes available closer to the start of the camp week and the waitlist for that session has been exhausted. Please contact the Zoo Camp director with any questions or concerns.

Will my child be with friends or relatives?

There will be circumstances that require us to split up age groups. We are committed to giving your child the best possible experience and will make every accommodation when possible. Requests need to be made in advance during the registration process and must be age appropriate. Please note that we cannot make group changes after camp has begun.

My child requires an aide. Can they attend camp?

Yes! One-to-one aides are allowed to attend. Before registering for camp, please contact the zoo camp director if you are providing your own aide. If you are interested in the ARC of Onondaga's free one-to-one aide service, please contact Sarah Clark at sarah.clark@arcon.org for arrangement of care. Please note, to qualify for this service, you will need to be registered and have recommendations from OPWDD. ARC of Onondaga has limited number of aides available, so it is not guaranteed that an aide will be provided.

What if the week I want is filled?

You will have the opportunity to be added to the wait list during the registration process. If space becomes available during the waiting period, we will notify all parties on the wait list in the order received. You can opt to be removed from a wait list at any time.

Is Before and After Care available for children who need to arrive early or be picked up late?

Before and After Care may include games or quiet reading and are not part of the normal zoo curriculum. Before Care runs 8-9 a.m. and After Care runs 4–5 p.m. You may register your camper for one or both sessions. Cost is \$50 per week per camper for either session. Before and After Care is not offered per diem; you must register and pay for the full week. Pre-registration is required - no drop-ins. If you are late picking up your camper from the regular camp day or Before and After Care, late fees will apply.

Frequently Asked Questions

What can my child expect at Zoo Camp? Your child will participate in fun, hands-on

learning that explores every aspect of our zoo. We provide every child with a camp T-shirt. Each camper is required to wear the camp T-shirt daily to identify them as a zoo camper to the public and zoo staff. If you would like to purchase additional T-shirts, please order online during the registration process.

What are the qualifications of the

Can I stay with my child during camp hours? Zoo camp is about making new friends and memories, and parents at camp can inhibit a child's experience. Additionally, room capacities limit the number of people that can be in each room. Therefore, we ask that parents refrain from staying with children during camp.

What if my child needs medication?

Zoo Camp instructors are prohibited by law from administering any medication to children at Zoo Camp except for Epi-pens in an emergency however, the camp health director can assist in self-administration. All medication and Epi-Pens must be received in the original container and be accompanied by written authorization by their doctor. Camp staff can assist with the application of sunscreen and insect repellant with written permission.

What if I need to cancel?

If your child is enrolled and you must cancel for any reason, your registration fee is nonrefundable unless a child on the waiting list can fill your space. In the event the cancelled space is filled, a \$25 processing fee will be deducted from your refund.

Will there be an option to purchase lunch for my child?

Catering at the Zoo will offer a weekly meal plan that can be purchased during registration or added later. Please note that last-minute and day-of requests may not be honored based on availability.

Zoo Camp staff?

All staff members have experience working with children. Camp staff pass a criminal background check and receive extensive training before camp starts. The camp director and other zoo staff are trained in CPR and first aid.

What if my camper has special needs?

Please contact the camp director at zoocamp@ rosamondgiffordzoo.org prior to registration to discuss your child's needs.

Will my child be able to go into exhibits with the animals?

We have a variety of outreach animals that your child may encounter. For the safety of your children and our animals, contact with most animals is prohibited.

Does my child need to be potty trained?

Yes. We require that all children be potty trained to attend camp.

Why do I need my driver's license to pick up my child?

For your child's safety, we require that every person picking your child up from Zoo Camp be registered with our instructors. Before your child can leave zoo grounds, the designated person picking him/her up must provide a photo ID and check out your child.
